

NATOLIN FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME FOR YOUNG PROFESSIONALS FROM UKRAINE, MOLDOVA, AND GEORGIA

The Natolin Fellowship Programme is funded by the EU and by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Lithuania as part of and in the framework of the project EU4YOUTH - Phase III Youth Employment, and Entrepreneurship programme Scholarship Scheme for Eastern Partners at the College of Europe in Natolin. ('EU4Youth-Natolin4EaP').

The Natolin Fellowship Programme is a new 8-month non-degree professional development programme for PhD students or PhD graduates coming from Ukraine, Moldova, and Georgia which can facilitate the development of professional skills, enhance employability of young professionals and their personal development, and ultimately expose them to different views and knowledge-sharing, taking whenever possible young people with fewer opportunities.

Concurrently, it is designed to reinforce European Union's efforts to support Ukraine and Moldova who have already started their EU accession negotiations, as well as Georgia who has been granted a candidate status. This Programme embodies a perfect platform for aspiring young professionals to contribute to the progress of their countries by building human capital.

THE OFFER OF THE NATOLIN FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME COMPRISES:

- 8 month-long non-degree professional and employability-oriented programme for PhD students or PhD graduates coming from Ukraine, Moldova and Georgia
- The programme is tailored for individuals with a robust educational and professional interest in European affairs
- Divided into two phases:

1

The initial phase, lasting around 5 months, will incorporate knowledge- and skills-based modules in traditional (small learning groups), blended, and e-learning formats comprising 260h sessions and meetings in total.

The second phase, lasting around 3 months, will be in the form of an internship/traineeship, in virtual or blended formats.

- In addition to the core Programme, the admitted participants will:
 - cooperate with committed mentors, who will provide individualised learning approach and oversee research papers of the Fellows;
 - participate in up to three thematic conferences and in short research field trips/visits, local events by receiving up to 1 000 EUR support in total;
 - Improve their English language skills for research, professional and communication purposes and take part in cross-cultural workshops
- Organised in a top-notch academic environment; at the premises of the College of Europe in Natolin
- Supported financially with a total amount of 9 576 EUR of stipend for 8 months and contribution to travel expenses in the amount not exceeding 530 EUR for a round trip; including an insurance for the whole duration of the Programme
- Dedicated training and comfortable and well-equipped office space for implementation of the programme activities
